## WHAT IS AN MTP?

Metropolitan transportation plans are planning documents used by metropolitan planning organizations to project an area's transportation needs for the next 25 years. Every five years, both the current and projected regional transportation system of the region are analyzed to develop a transportation vision to address regional needs and better serve the system's users. As funding for transportation is limited, the MTP also considers how to best utilize the federal funding available to the region.

## WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE MTP?

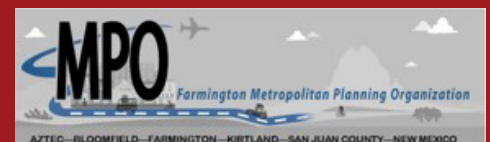
Key components within the MTP include:

- *Existing conditions analysis*
- *Growth projections and land use*
- *Analysis for all modes of transportation (i.e. single-occupancy vehicles, public transit, pedestrian, bicycle, aviation)*
- *Available Funding*
- *Project lists*
- *Integration of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan*
- *Freight analysis (i.e. truck, air, and rail)*
- *Integration of the FMPO Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan*
